Westmoreland Food Bank Food Drive at Redstone!



Resident Spotlight: Wash Gjebre

Wash Gjebre, Greensburg resident, has a fascinating and fulfilling history in journalism. Journalism came to Wash on a whim around the end of high school, thinking it would make for an interesting career path and future. Wash graduated from the University of Pittsburgh with a BA in Journalism in 1952. He landed his first reporting gig at a local newspaper in Homestead called the Daily Messenger. There, Wash would cover general reporting which was just about anything interesting, including a lot of feature writing. "It was all about the beat," says Wash. He also had his own column called The Monday's Wash, covering the day's activities and lighthearted stories. After working there for a few years, Wash moved on to his reporting role at the Tribune Review. Among his reporting, he had a column called I Was Just Thinking. Wash also had a compelling and rare reporting milestone in his career while at the Trib. He interviewed one of the 706 survivors of the Titanic right in Greensburg! "A reporter covers all kinds of disasters...but nothing like the Titanic," Wash says about the feeling of the interview. Wash left the Trib and moved on to the Pittsburgh Post Gazette where, among many things, he reported on the beat of city crimes, police and was in charge of covering the Westmoreland Bureau. "The Post Gazette was quite an accomplishment", says Wash referring to it as a big city paper. He retired from there after 20 years. Wash also notes that he was at one time an editor of the Squirrel Hill News and also of the Forrest Hills News, both local papers. Out of his entire career, Wash prides himself on always being fair in his reporting in addition to the connections he would make with judges, politicians, representatives of Congress, and local authorities. Dorothy, his loving wife of 71 years, and Wash are active members of the United Church of Christ in Greensburg and outstanding

members of the community!


