

NYC Christmas trip!

Nov. 20th – Nov. 22nd

We go a little early for all of the holiday splendor, but we will once again enjoy a fantastic trip to New York City just before the holidays. We will depart Redstone Greensburg at 7 am on Friday, November 20th. We'll travel by motorcoach this year to make the trip a little faster and less expensive! We'll stop about every 2 hours along the way but still should arrive in the city by 3 pm. We'll check in to the Crowne Plaza Manhattan



Times Square, perfectly located at 7th and 51st street right in the heart of the action. Your time is your own in the city, unless you choose to participate in one of our optional group activities. In order to maximize your time in the city, our motorcoach won't pick us up on Sunday afternoon until 4 pm. You will be able to check your bags at the hotel for the day. Attend a worship service, visit a museum, go to brunch... enjoy the extra time in the city.

Prices for motorcoach, driver gratuity, hotel and fees are as follows:

\$825 for one person in a single room

\$505 per person in a king room for two people

\$530 per person in a two queen room for two people

\$415 per person in a two queen room for three people

\$360 per person in a two queen room for four people

The following optional add-ons are available:

Friday evening – dinner and a show \$150 – we aren't sure what show it will be yet, but it's sure to be amazing! Right now, tickets for most shows are only on sale through September, so we need to wait a little longer to pin this down. This is the true price for dinner and a show.

Saturday morning - DONUT You Know it's a WALKABOUT? Lisa will lead us on a walkabout tasting several of NYC's most popular donut places along the way. You will need to provide your own subway fare via a credit or debit card, and a fee of \$15 per person to cover the costs of the treat stops. Our walk will take about 2 hours and will cover approximately a mile, primarily in the Soho/Flatiron District.

Sunday morning – we will offer a final group activity on Sunday morning – perhaps the Metropolitan Museum of Art!
